RUNAWAY BAY: Glenn Poy-nor, 81, died on Sunday, October 4, 2009.

He was born August 28, 1928 in Breckenridge. His father was a lifetime employee of Lone Star Gas Company and moved his family where the work took him. In 1943, they moved to Cisco where Glenn attended and graduated from Cisco High School in 1945. He went on to graduate from Texas Tech with a B.S. in Geology in 1950. While at Texas Tech, he married fellow student Fern Huestis in 1948, who had also graduated from Cisco High School; the couple had 3 sons over the next 5 years. Except for a brief stint as a dry goods store manager, Glenn worked for the rest of his life in the oil and gas business, rising to a



regional manager position with BJ Oilfield Services and then in 1966 forming an oil and gas production partnership with his brother Max in Jacksboro.

He was preceded in death by his mother and father, Daisy Sims Poy-nor and Aubrey Poy-nor, residents of Bridgeport. He is survived by his wife, Fern DeLois Huestis Poy-nor, and his two brothers' families: Max Poy-nor and his wife Stacie of Fort Worth and Judge Clay Poy-nor and his wife Sandra of Bridgeport.

Glenn and Fern have three sons: Dr. Wesley Poy-nor and his wife Kay of Richmond, Virginia; Garland Poy-nor of Chico; and Richard Poy-nor and his wife Cathy of Jacksboro. All three sons graduated from Jacksboro High School. Glenn and Fern have 5 grandchildren and 3 great grandsons. The grandchildren are Patrick Poy-nor and his wife Kirsten of Virginia Beach, Virginia; Ariane Reagor and her husband Shannan of Royse City; Douglas Poy-nor of Corinth; Adrienne Poy-nor of Corinth; and Nicholas Glenn Poy-nor of Jacksboro. Ariane and Shannan are the parents of the 3 great grandsons: Noah, Nicholas and Darin Reagor. Glenn has 7 nieces and nephews on the Poy-nor side and 4 nieces on the Huestis side of the family.

While living in Jacksboro, Glenn was a member of the Jacksboro ISD Board of Education for 5 years. After moving to Runaway Bay Resort in 1974, he was intimately involved in developing the city's structure and charter.

Glenn and Fern have been members of the Runaway Bay Community Church for the past 35 years; Glenn has been a deacon and treasurer of the church for the past dozen years.

Glenn had a lively love of playing golf, especially at Runaway Bay. In his later years, he became a cattle rancher and enjoyed chasing cows with his big blue tractor.
